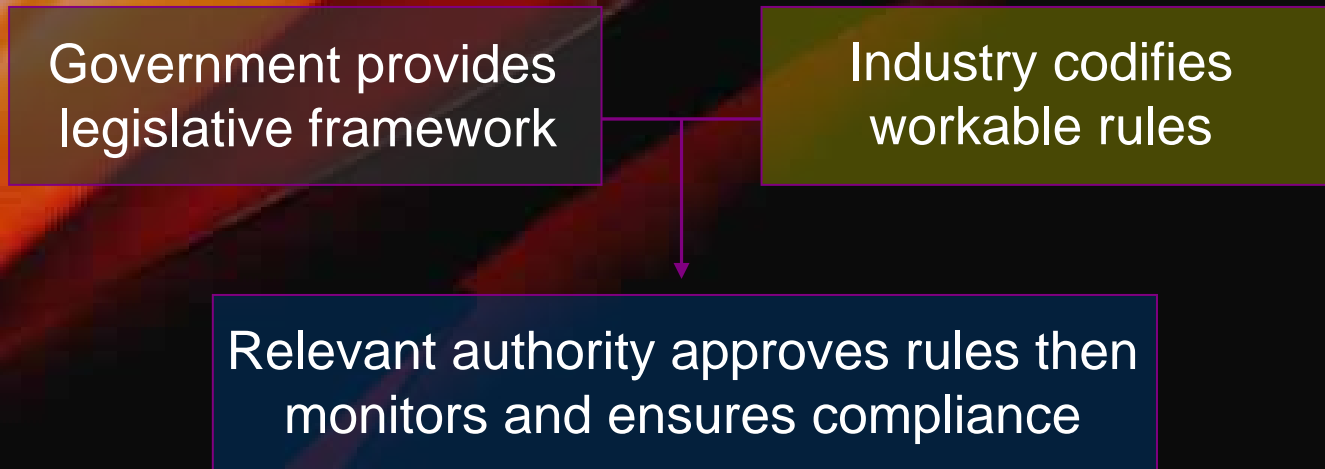

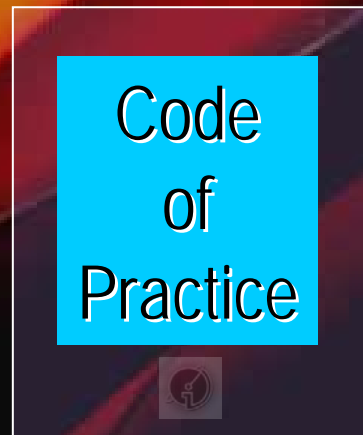

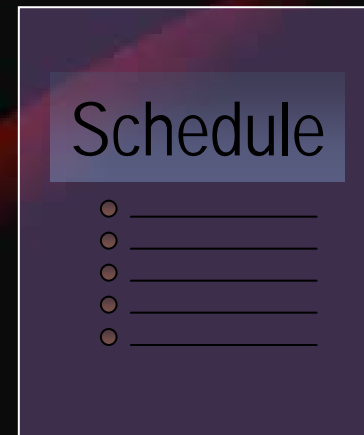
IIA content codes: approach & structure

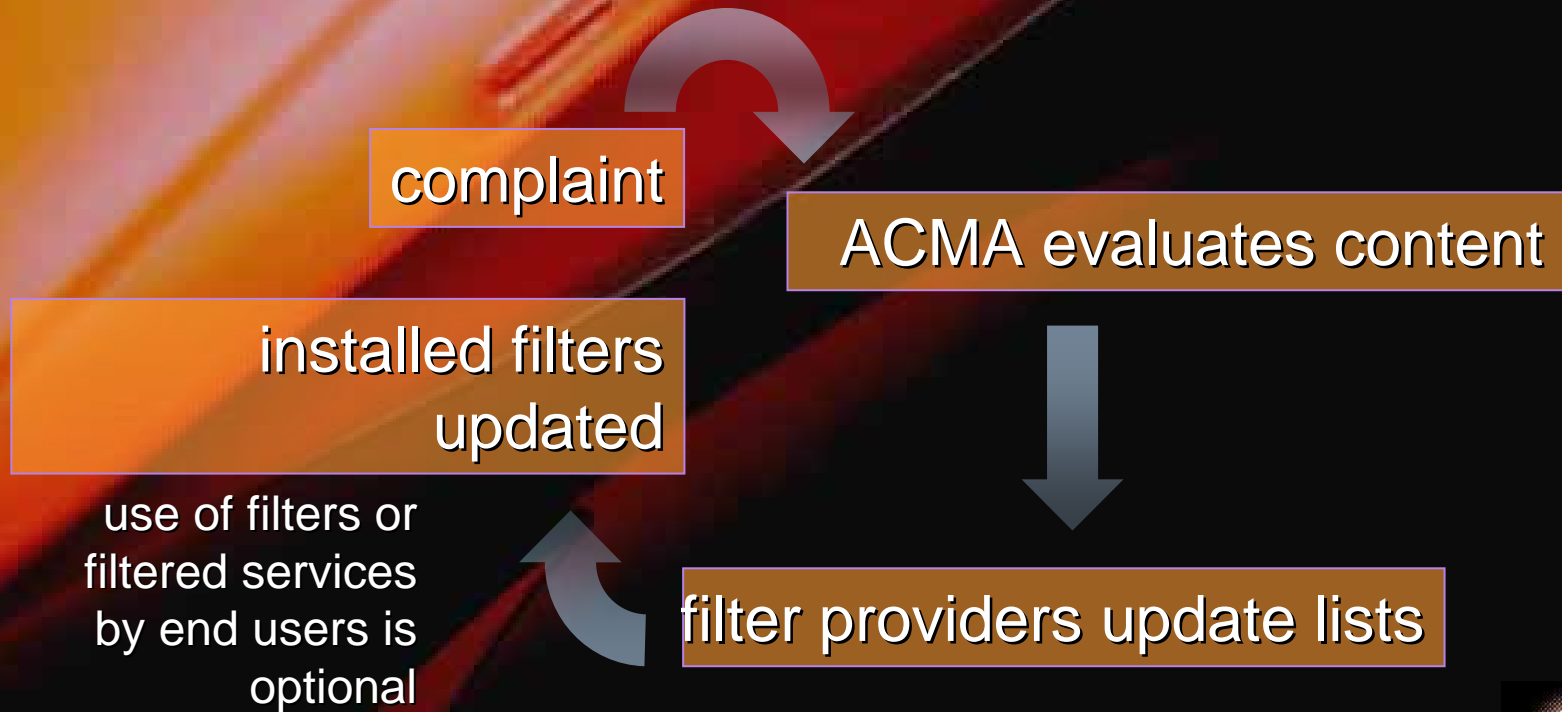

New obligations for filter companies

- ◆ Introduction of new effectiveness test
- ◆ Independent 'phase' testing
- ◆ Can now qualify for IIA Family Friendly status
ie. accreditation provided they meet the test
criteria



Family Friendly Seal

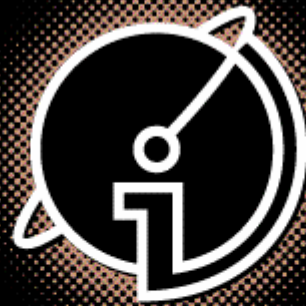
- ◆ Objectives:
 - to raise community awareness about their options
 - to provide incentive to proactively comply with IIA Codes
- ◆ Now *extended* to apply to content hosts, mobile carriers and filtering products and services
- ◆ “Look for the Ladybird seal”
