

IPv4 address transfer services


- Support for Intra and inter-RIR transfer
- Pre-approval service, up to 24 month requirement
 - Pre-approval listing (optional)
- Broker listing, 4 registered so far
- apnic-transfers@apnic.net mailing list
- Public transfer log
- Transfer fees applied
 - 20% of the transferred block's annual fee (other holdings not included in the calculation)
 - Payable by the recipient, or by the source if transferred out of APNIC region

Impact of policy/practice changes





Inter-RIR experience

- Completed transfer: 6 (as of end Jan 2013)
- Transfer time (including evaluation): 1 – 2 weeks
- Successfully transferred live network
- ARIN & APNIC stats overlap one day after transfer due to time zone difference

Interesting observations

- A group of companies has been observed to be transferring between themselves in circles
 - It stops after the implementation of transfer fee
- New members are created to receive last /8 allocations and then quickly transferred to an existing member
 - Currently being discussed in the policy-sig (prop-106)
- 32 out of 2,110 (1.5%) delegations from 103/8 have been transferred
 - 15 APNIC members have more than a /22 from 103/8 in their account. The highest number is 5 x /22s in one account.
 - As a comparison, 64 out of 3,580 (1.8%) delegations have been transferred before APNIC implemented its last /8 policy
